# **Mapping Monuments**

#### 7 March-29 June

Following on from a very successful and well attended conference on Ordnance Survey heritage in November 2023 in Ballykelly, this new travelling exhibition further explores local Ordnance Survey. Looking at traces, sites and stories along the Lough Foyle Baseline, this fascinating exhibition includes surveying objects and artist interpretation.

This exhibition was produced by volunteers from the Mapping Monuments heritage project, the Binevenagh Coastal Lowlands Landscape Partnership Scheme and Queens University Belfast through funding from The National Lottery Heritage Fund.



# **Threads & Stitches**

#### 11 March-15 June

Developed from the *Threads and Stitches of our Changing Landscape* exhibition and accompanying workshops held in 2023, come along to see the finished textile piece inspired by the Binevenagh landscape and created by workshop attendees alongside Conflict Textiles. Paper bees created by local primary schools who attended schools' workshops will also be on display.

This project was funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund through CCGHT and the Binevenagh Coastal Lowlands Landscape Partnership Scheme.



### Proceed as Normal **Hannah Smith**

A figurative artist based in Belfast, Hannah Smith works predominately in oils exploring performance in everyday life, drawing inspiration from dystopian narratives. Hannah's work is currently also exhibited at the Saatchi Gallery, London in an exhibition curated by The Delphian Gallery.

# **Birds with No Passports**

Currently based in Belfast, John Brown is a poet, visual artist, and editor originally from Limavady. As a visual artist John has exhibited for over twenty years throughout Ireland and the UK and has curated exhibitions in the Netherlands and Ireland. *Birds with No Passports* includes drawings, collage, mixed media works and sculpture from found objects to capture real and imagined birds. In this new exhibition and accompanying book of poems, John explores the differences between birds and humans ~ how birds and humans differ in dealing with love, death, migration, borders, ecology and how their rituals, rites of passage and language differ. With humour, John punctures the notion that just because humans do not have bird brains and do have language, they are far more intelligent than birds. John asks simple questions that are difficult to answer. Can humans make birdsongs? Can birds speak a language?


