Threads and Stitches of our Changing Landscape

1st July to 21 October

From airfields to cultivation, turf cutting to wind turbines, prehistoric farmers to 19th century industry, the wider Binevenagh area has witnessed extensive land-use change throughout history. Exploring some of the work being done by the Binevenagh and Coastal Lowland Landscape Partnership Scheme to help restore environmental balance, the exhibition includes objects and artefacts from Museum Services Collections as well as a selection of textiles curated by Conflict Textiles which reflect the environmental and land pressures which face communities around the world.

Alongside the exhibition, we will be running workshops to guide local groups in creating their own textile pieces which reflect the local environmental concern they feel most strongly about. If you are interested in participating, please contact grace@ccght.org

World Illustration Awards

18 August - 29 September

In 2015 we were the first arts venue in Ireland to host the prestigious World Illustration Awards and are delighted to continue to showcase the best of international illustration.

The most prestigious platform for emerging new talent and professional illustrators across the world, an incredible 5,000+ entries were submitted by illustrators from 77 countries. After a competitive judging process across 10 categories, 200 projects and the 44 award-winning and highly commended projects featured in the catalogue, online showcase and digital showreel. This unique exhibition delivered by the Association of Illustrators in partnership with the USA-based Directory of Illustration, is a varied and vibrant survey of illustration at the cutting edge.

A visual response to a series of truths, stories and memories as told by a group of women as they worked with socially engaged artist Lesley Cherry over the past year.

Cherry continues her interpretation of these stories of domesticity, empowerment, class, culture, and secrets through her use of pattern, found objects, text, and mixed media.

The work is open to interpretation and speculation, all entwined with a fragile beauty in her use of wallpaper, paper dollies, lace, collage, paint and markmaking, and often incorporating a sense of humour and kitchness to the work, despite the serious issues being addressed.


