Dr Andrew Pickering FRHistS, an Associate Lecturer with the University of Plymouth and Chair of Bruton Museum, has written extensively on the history of the area and wider region. In 2021 he published a book, *Steinbeck and the Matter of Arthur*, which details Steinbeck's important connections with Somerset.

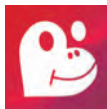

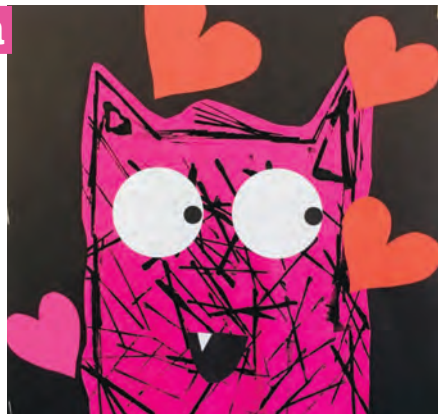

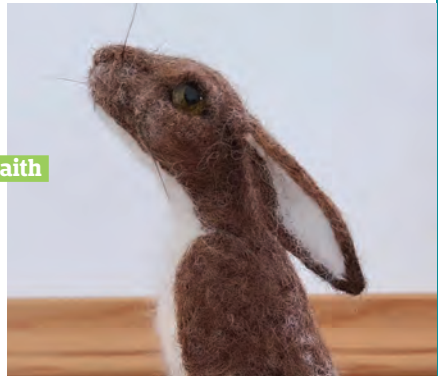
